Author last name, First name. Title of Book. Place of publication: Publisher, year.

Cooper, Michael. Jamestown, 1607. New York: Holiday House, 2007.

ARTICLE IN AN ENCYCLOPEDIA or Reference book with many contributing authors

"Title of article." Title of Encyclopedia or book. Edition. (include year if not part of edition.)

"Siversmith." World Book Encyclopedia. 2007 ed.

"Henry Hudson." Biography for beginners: World explorers. First edition. 2003.

MAGAZINE ARTICLE

Author last name, First name. "Title of article." Title of Magazine. Month, year: page.

Durway, Julie. "Young Ben Franklin." Applesseeds. December, 2004:2-6.
